### Good news

One of our system goals within the Lincolnshire Education Plan is to develop **a great pipeline of leaders** in our county. We have had a great start! There has been huge increase in the uptake of leadership programmes within county. There are 12 leaders undertaking NPQH, 43 leaders on NPQSL and 32 on NPQML. In addition, there are 14 leaders on the Aspiring to Headship Programme (previously known as LeadLincs). ### Lincolnshire Core Programme 2019-20

This is the second year of the Lincolnshire Core Programme, a programme which has been designed and created by Lincolnshire System Leaders to compliment the DfE School Improvement Offer (DSIO) and the Securing Good Programme (SGP).

It consists of a series of units which school leaders can access to support school improvement, leadership development and resource management. This programme is fully funded for schools included in the DfE School Improvement Offer (DSIO) and schools that have been identified through the local authority Securing Good Programme (SGP).

### Focus on ...

#### Aspects of Engagement - SEND Assessment

Many schools will already be aware that last Autumn the DfE announced that P scales 1 to 4 will be replaced with a variant of the 7 aspects of engagement as the statutory assessment. This new assessment will become statutory from academic year 2020/21. Training has been developed and this will be disseminated in the spring and summer terms. We are proud to say that the two of our Specialist Teaching Schools, LEARN and INSPIRE have been successfully-awarded the contract to recruit Lead Trainers to deliver the training for the East Midlands and Humber region. This training will be **free** and the expectation will be that a representative from ALL primary and special schools attend.
