We also want to create systematic opportunities for multiple encounters with the world of work supported by good careers teaching, including through other subjects. The ambition extends to working with Primary School and Further Education in 2020-21.

This term we have seen clusters set up in every district with over 80% of secondary schools

engaging. The aim is to share best practice and resources, working in partnership with the Lincolnshire Enterprise Partnership (LEP), LincHigher and others to deliver our ambition for Lincolnshire - that every learner succeeds. Research 2 Practice Science Project – Can you help? We are working in partnership with the University of Lincoln on a research project funded by The Wellcome Trust which will focus on evidence-informed science teaching. This collaborative research project, will work with and be guided by expert teachers to develop packages of evidence-informed teaching materials for use with mentors and trainee teachers. To support this activity, we are looking to increase the Research School's capacity at key points during the project with around 6 – 9 days per person from spring term 2020 to summer term 2021.

In particular, we are looking for science specialists – either SLEs or science leads in primary and secondary schools. This is a great development opportunity for science specialists to contribute to the education of trainees and to be part of a high-profile research project.
